

ASSET INTEGRITY MANAGEMENT POLICY



Goal

Huron is committed to ensuring the technical integrity of our wellbore, pipeline and facility assets. Our asset integrity programs will help ensure safe, efficient and long-term operations. Our goal is to prevent any asset failure that causes injury, environmental release or significant equipment damage.

Values

- Huron will complete risk based technical evaluations to help identify and mitigate potential failures.
- Huron will ensure management of change processes are in place for our production infrastructure and well operation programs.
- Huron will maintain technical standards and specifications that include both material and design considerations for our assets.
- Huron will ensure personnel are trained to operate our production infrastructure.
- Huron shall meet or exceed applicable regulatory requirements and industry standards.

Accountability

Management:

- Demonstrate and lead Huron's commitment to and administer this policy as required.
- Ensure engineering and design standards are understood and adhered to.
- Ensure personnel have the training and support needed to implement this policy.

Supervisors:

- Ensure work is executed in accordance with project designs, including well programs, drawings, specifications and standards.
- Provide feedback on project designs and review possible improvements as required.

Employees and Contractors:

- Execute work as provided in the project designs and programs.

Compliance

Huron expects all employees and contractors to comply with this Asset Integrity Management Policy. Wilful negligence or non-compliance is cause for dismissal or contract termination.
